Guam's 7 Historical Eras

2,000 BC – 1668: Ancient Guam.

- Settlers arrived on the island, and evolved into the CHamoru people.

1668 – 1898: Spanish Era.

- Guam becomes a colony of Spain, until the Spanish - American War of 1898.

1898 – 1941: US Naval Era.

- US Navy ruled on the island, CHamoru's petitioned for US Citizenship as early as 1901.

1941 – 1944: World War II/Japanese Era.

- December 8, 1941, Japanese Imperial Forces bombarded the island and gained control, until 1944.

1944-1950: Post-War Era.

- The destruction of WWII took a toll on the people and the island.

1950 – 1970: Guamanian Era.

- Granted US Citizenship by the Organic Act of 1950, which initiated the birth of the Government of Guam.

1970 – Present: Contemporary Guam.

- The first elected Governor of Guam took office and the island experienced economic growth and urban development.
